We Will Sing Again!

Dear Friends – Shannah Tovah!

It's hard to believe that almost a whole year has passed since that October 7th 2023 Simchat Torah: a shocking, horrific, and nightmarish day when the



Nova Music Festival in Southern Israel was invaded by terrorists and the people were massacred or taken hostage. The local kibbutzim right near the festival and bordering Gaza were also invaded in the cruelest most barbaric way.

The year has been long, emotional, difficult, and frustrating. We've been waiting for some kind of resolution, for the hostages to come home (alive), for the rockets from Hezbollah in Lebanon and Syria to stop raining down on Northern Israel, for the endless hateful comments about Jewish people and Israel to stop pouring forth, for the efforts to boycott and choke Israel to diminish, for the cruel psychological warfare to end.

For me, personally, because of the deep heartache and continual worry over this current situation, joyously singing some of the prayers has been difficult. I found it hard to sing *Oseh Shalom* when *shalom* seems so elusive right now. Despite the ongoing war, I did go to Israel this summer and spent two weeks studying with a group of other educators at the Yad Vashem Holocaust Museum. Ironically, I felt safe in Israel! People are living their lives as best as they can and not cowering at home. Restaurants and cafes are open, talented street

musicians are playing beautiful songs. I walked and walked the familiar streets of Jerusalem, people—watched, and prayed that Israel as a Jewish, democratic country will survive. I saw the resilience of the people of Israel, not just the Jewish people, but the society as a whole. There are Arab–Israelis, there are many workers from Asian countries; Israel is a mosaic of people and a small country surviving, despite the push from Iran and others to destroy her.

Despite the hardships and setbacks, as Jews we are inveterate optimists. Judaism is truly unique among the world's religions in its belief that we can change, overcome, and even transform. We are a people that does not resign itself to fate; hope is a mitzvah. The theology, holidays, and prayers all express and reinforce this approach to life. The High Holy Days liturgy is especially beautiful, meaningful, and uplifting. It leads us to search our souls – to forgive, to make changes, to try to improve ourselves as we begin a new year.

As we enter this High Holy Days season, we will sing again, even the words from Psalm 96, which I haven't been able to sing all year, "Sing unto God a new song". But just as the Israelis are saying "We will dance again", I say "We will sing again"! I hope the beauty, poetry, and profound meaning of our prayers will inspire you. Our Yizkor this year will reflect our personal losses, as it always does, and will also include poems and prayers to mark the losses this year for Israel and Jewish people everywhere.

Observing Yahrzeits at CBE

A yahrzeit is the anniversary of a death. It is traditional to light a 24-hour memorial candle in your home, at sundown on the evening before the date of the yahrzeit.

Names of the remembered are read out at Shabbat services on the Friday night immediately preceding the yahrzeit date. Friends and family attend this service, and participate in the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish. Many people also make a donation to the temple in honor of the remembered, as a mitzvah on behalf of a loved one who is no longer here to do so.

Those who have yahrzeits on file with the Temple office will receive reminders before the dates. We ask for your help in keeping this information current and complete.
