Each week I will send home some special Hebrew words of the week for you to review together. The last page contains a special creative expression exercise that would be a quick and fun project to do at home. If you complete the project, send me a picture of it! We'll add it to our Weekly Parent Newsletter. The *Now I Know My Alef-Bet* Hebrew curriculum works hand-in-hand with the *Shanah Tovah* Judaica curriculum which focuses on teaching the vocabulary of Jewish life. Each and every lesson centers on introducing, reviewing, using, reusing and exposing students to the words used in Jewish celebrations. These words become the foundation on which a Jewish identity and a Jewish education can be built.

Kitah Bet (Grades 2-5) will be continuing on their journey toward becoming Hebrew readers. Z'man Likro ~ Time to Read Hebrew curriculum reinforces letter/sound recognition while simultaneously introducing the vowel markings that accompany the letter sounds. With each lesson, students will begin to sound out key Hebrew words. When students can read fluently, they can chant Torah or pray in Hebrew with the congregation! The Judaica curriculum for the year is part of a series called Building Jewish Identity. It's a four-part series, and this year we will be using Volume 1: Our Community. Throughout the year, we will focus on our rich heritage, our family stories, the symbols and rituals that teach us about our past, and the mitzvot, or good deeds, that we can do today to enhance our Jewish identity. In addition, we will be using the textbook Experiencing the Jewish Holidays which takes an active, experiential approach to Jewish holidays by fusing actual celebrations with role-play, cooking, eating, shaking, sounding, and many other activities!

Kitah Gimel (Grades 6-7) will be deepening their understanding of Jewish ritual and the concepts inherent in our mitzvot while learning to read Hebrew and pray. The Hineni 1: The New Hebrew Through Prayer curriculum encourages students to feel comfortable participating in prayer services and the rituals of synagogue and home, sharpening their reading skills and developing a familiarity and understanding of ritual and mitzvot. Our Judaica curriculum is made up of two texts. I am very excited to introduce a new text to our Religious School called The God Book: A Necessarily Incomplete Look at the Essence of God. According to the textbook author, Rabbi Paul Yedwab, this book is "an antidote to premature atheism." This is not a theology textbook: It's a thinking, feeling, and sharing textbook. Each chapter features a "My God Diary," in which students can write about their feelings, thoughts, doubts and affirmations about the "Unknowable." Our Jewish Holiday curriculum for this year is called Rediscovering the Jewish Holidays: Tradition in a Modern Voice. It invites students to not only share in the treasures of Judaism - its core truths and values - but also to enrich our tradition by making their own contributions to modern Jewish Life.
