Dear Friends,

Shalom from Romania. I'm on a trip to see historic Jewish places and learn about Jewish life in Romania. You could call it a *Tiyul Shorashim* of sorts–a journey of seeking our



roots-as some of the members of our group have Romanian ancestors, and whether or not we come directly from here, we all come from someplace where Jews had to flee, and many were European towns or villages that resemble what we're seeing. It was very exciting when two women in our group who are second cousins found the names of their great uncle, a prominent doctor, and his family, listed on a plaque in the beautiful Bucharest Choral Synagogue. They also found records of him in the National Jewish Archive here.

We've traveled from the capital, Bucharest, to Cluj in Transylvania (no Dracula!); these cities are very modern and beautiful. There are synagogues and a small but active Jewish community. As we've driven through the mountains and lush countryside, it's like going back in time. Jews lived in all of these towns and villages. We're now in Sighet, the town where Elie Wiesel was born and grew up, until he was deported. We visited his home, which is now a museum, and learned more about his family and childhood there. Jews comprised about 25% of Sighet's population before the War. Sadly, in 1944, 38,000 Jewish people from Sighet and the surrounding region were taken in a 6-week period to Auschwitz, and the vibrant Jewish life of this area was destroyed. Surprisingly, the ultra-Orthodox Satmar Hasidim, who originated from the nearby town of Satu Mare in the late 1800's, come *here* on pilgrimage (not Israel) and have built a huge, ornate, \$5m synagogue complex, complete with a luxurious mikveh for the men to use (for their spiritual purification)! Other than that, there are very few Jewish people here today.

As we've driven miles and miles through the vast Transylvania region, I've been struck by how peaceful and tranquil it feels, even just one mile from the southern border with Ukraine. It's ironic, because this region has been conquered and reconquered through the centuries, by Romans, Ottomans, Hungarians, Germans and Russians. It's amazing that, just over 30 years ago, this area was under Communist rule. I guess it shows us how much political situations can change and that regimes and rulers come and go.

It has been a fascinating experience to travel to this beautiful country and see the history, the grand palaces and ornate buildings, the green hills and countryside, and marvel at the advances they've made. At the same time, like traveling through much (all?) of Europe, it's heartbreaking to know that most of the Jewish communities were destroyed in the Holocaust and it took too long to stop it. Being here and seeing things first-hand enables me to treasure the rich history and culture of our people by learning about it and bearing witness to what still exists today.

May we be proud of our Jewish heritage and support Jewish life. Bring your friends to shul and let's enjoy our community.





A yahrzeit is the anniversary of a death. It is traditional to light a 24-hour memorial candle in your home, at sundown on the evening before the date of the yahrzeit.

Names of the remembered are read out at Shabbat services on the Friday night immediately preceding the yahrzeit date. Friends and family attend this service, and participate in the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish. Many people also make a donation to the temple in honor of the remembered, as a mitzvah on behalf of a loved one who is no longer here to do so.

Those who have yahrzeits on file with the Temple office will receive reminders before the dates. We ask for your help in keeping this information current and complete. 
